Description of Service Options

Terms and Definitions

Preparation of Remains – Embalming (preservation), cosmetics, dressing, and casketing.

Visitation/Viewing – A time for family to view their loved one, share memories, grieve together, and receive friends.

Funeral Service – A time when family and friends gather with the body of their loved one present for music, scripture, inspirational readings, and the sharing of memories.

Memorial Service - A time when family and friends gather *without* the body of their loved one present for music, scripture, inspirational readings, and the sharing of memories.

Interment/Burial – The moment, following a funeral service, when the remains are buried or entombed in their final resting place. The burial often includes a brief service of committal.

Cremation - Cremation is the process by which the remains are reduced to ashes. All or some of ashes may be kept in a container (called an urn), buried, scattered, or entombed.

Service Options

Traditional: Includes preparation of remains, visitation held at the funeral home or a church, funeral service, and interment.

Same-Day Visitation and Funeral: Includes preparation of remains, same-day visitation and funeral service at either the funeral home or a church, and interment.

Graveside Service: Includes preparation of remains and funeral service is held at the cemetery. Viewing may take place at the cemetery or arrangements may be made for a private family viewing at the funeral home before the service.

Cremation: When cremation is chosen, there are two options:

1. Includes preparation of remains, a visitation and/or funeral service with cremation to follow.
2. If no visitation or funeral services are desired, cremation is performed as soon as possible. A memorial service may be arranged if direct cremation is chosen.

Immediate Burial: The remains are placed directly into a casket or container chosen by the family with no previous preparation of the remains. Usually, burial at a cemetery of choice can take place within 24 hours of death. A service with no viewing may be held at the cemetery.

Anatomical Donation: Upon death, the remains are removed to a school of medicine or other medical research facility for the training of medical students and/or research. There is no preparation of the remains. A memorial service may be arranged if desired.

General Price Information
